



# Reception Autumn 2024



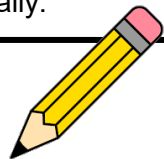
## UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Through exploring the natural world the children will begin to understand and recognise seasonal changes and the effect this has on plants, wildlife and humans. They will be discussing members of their immediate family as well as their community. They will learn to recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate in different ways and learn about festivals including Harvest, Diwali and Christmas.



## LITERACY

The children will have the opportunity to enjoy books, stories, rhymes and songs. They will be encouraged to re-read books to develop confidence and understanding in reading. They will make meaningful marks and begin to form letters with accuracy when writing their name. The children will follow the Read Write Inc. programme to develop their phonic knowledge daily.



## COMMUNICATION & LANGUAGE

During carpet sessions the children will be developing the core skills for listening to peers and adults and responding to their own and others thoughts. They will listen to stories with the theme of 'Starting School' and 'Families' as well as favourite songs, stories and rhymes.

## PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The children will learn new routines including where carpet spaces, pegs and trays are. They will be taught the PROUD code of conduct and focus on class rules and expectations. The children will learn to select and return resources independently focusing on manners, sharing and turn taking.



## EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

Through the use of music the children will explore their senses, learn songs, rhymes and develop movements. They will also describe how music makes them feel. Role play will be supported by the children's use of a variety of materials to create props for the retelling of familiar stories.



## PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

The theme for physical activity will include jumping, rolling and walking. Fine motor skills will be developed through drawing, threading, cutting, sticking, and building models. The children will be taught how to move safely within indoor and outdoor spaces and develop their pincer grip.



## MATHEMATICS

Using rhyme, the children will develop and apply number, counting skills and counting to 10 and beyond. They will identify number bonds to five and compare quantities using language related to more and less. There will be a focus on the recognition of 2D shapes and their properties. The children will demonstrate their understanding of positional and shape language.
